## Knowledge Federation as Ecosophy

In the late 1960s Arne Næss read Rachel Carson's book Silent Spring, about the harmful effects of pesticides; and realized that the dysfunctional way we think is the root cause of our civilization's deadly trends; and that to reverse them, philosophy will need to adopt a proactive and central role in our society; and that to be able to do that, academic philosophy will need to reconfigure itself, and become ecosophy. Today Næss is honored as the founding father of "deep ecology".

To streamline this so timely unfolding, we created a complete prototype called knowledge federation.

And now invite you to a dialog—a carefully designed and evolving process through which this prototype will be examined by experts, updated and put to use. The focus of this first dialog will be on ecosophy's foundation; we'll examine the different way to use the mind, and information, that knowledge federation prototype embodies and undertakes to promote.
